As the grilling season winds down and we all move to indoor meal preparation, there's a new food option in Beaverdale. Dinner Delights opened in late August at 2713 Beaver Avenue, in the shopping center next to Grounds for Celebration. Dinner Delights offers several options for customers. You can pre-order meals online or stop in to pick up prepared meals. Pre-ordering meals opens on Monday and closes on Thursday, with the meals ready to pick up the following Tuesday. Not that good at planning in advance? No problem, you can stop in to pick up "grab & go" meals during regular business hours, which are Tuesday-Friday 10:00 am to 7:00 pm or Saturdays 10:00 am to 2:00 pm.

Owner Andrea Love says running a food business is quite a departure from her field of study. She grew up in Iowa but attended undergraduate and law school out of state. She returned to Des Moines to raise a family and spend time as a stay-at-home mom. She always liked to cook, so seven years ago she started doing meal prep out of her clients' homes. She also did some catering. Business improved and she outgrew her home kitchen, so she started looking for a business property and landed on the space in Beaverdale, which previously had been Curbin' Cuisine.

Love says, "It's been going great. There's been a lot of interest and it's fun as people come in."

Meal prices range from \$12 to \$14, which includes an entrée and sides. Typical pre-order menu choices on the week this article was written included Chicken with Mushroom Leek Sauce, Hawaiian Meatballs, and Mongolian Beef. The menu changes every week. Vegetarian and gluten free options are also available.

Love says on Friday nights she offers a DYI pizza kit. Customers can stop in to pick up dough, sauce, cheese and toppings and go home to build and bake the pizza. Each week also offers a breakfast entrée, such as Breakfast Tacos. Dove says customers can also order complete Thanksgiving dinners.

The guy at the front of the 2024 Beaverdale Fall Festival parade with a friendly smile on his face was the parade's grand marshal, Francis Boggus. Francis was honored for his many years of volunteer work in Beaverdale.

Listing some of his accomplishments, Francis told The Sidewalk that he worked hard to advocate for the new Fareway Store on the city's Plan and Zoning



Commission, of which he is a board member. Francis served seven years on the Fall Festival board, has been a long-time member of the BNA's Public Affairs Committee, has volunteered for many projects at Holy Trinity, was a Cub Scout and Boy Scout troop leader for 15 years and most recently, has been heading a citizens' committee advocating for the renovation of Beaverdale Park.

"I was quite honored," Boggus says. "I love the visual appeal of Beaverdale, the variety of housing stock, and the diversity of the people who live here. I like having a residential area adjacent to a commercial district. Neighbors help you out. They shovel your snow. They watch your house when you're out of town."

The renovation of Beaverdale Park will take a lot of work moving forward. The city has placed dollars for upgrading the park in the 2025-2026 capital improvement plan. But replacing the aging playground equipment will take an estimated \$500,000 in private fundraising. "It's going to be a signature park in the city," Boggus said.

Boggus says the best part of living in Beaverdale is being near his daughter and grandchildren. "It's the best neighborhood I've lived in," he says. "There's great community spirit."

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


appy Retirement, Jan

IN THE MEANTIME—READ ABOUT MY **NEW LISTING WITH BEAVERDALE ROOTS:**

My new listing is a house with a colorful history, beginning its life in Beaverdale in 1935. It was moved in the late 70's to a former Stage Coach Stop in Ankeny. The land that the house sits on today was once part of that Stage Coach Line Site. The original 1868 Stage Coach Farm house still sits next door (and sold for \$456K in 2021). This unusual house lives on almost 1-acre. It is not a flat acre...it has trees and a stream. It has 3-bedrooms, 3-baths, 2,341 sq ft, a 3-car detached garage & 3-decks to enjoy the views. Enjoy this historical home and share its story with family & friends.





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
